#### **Water Police**

#### 131 444

The Western Australia Water Police operate 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. They provide search and rescue services and assist in reporting and investigating stolen vessels and marine equipment. The water police also listen to marine radio channels (HF – 6215, 4125, 8291 and 8176) as well as (VHF- 16 and 67) 24/7. If you're heading out on the water, keep the phone number and radio channels handle in case of an emergency.
